Ewen Swartz Makes Final Vows In Germany


It was a cold, windy 2 March in this year in Lahnstein Germany. Showers were slowly coming down from the heavens. But, the cold was

The new Council includes four members from the last administration: Provincial Fr. Stuart Bate, 1st Councillor Fr. Vusi Mazibuko, 2nd Councillor Fr. Sylvester David and 3rd Councillor Fr. Mhlanganisi Dlamini. Three new councillors were appointed. The 4th councillor is Fr. Zaba Mbanjwa parish priest at St Josephs Parish, Cedara and lecturer in African theology at St Joseph's Theological institute. The 5th Councillor, is Fr. Siphon Kunene the new Mission superior in Zimbabwe. The 6th Councillor is Fr. Wayne Weldschidt, Parish priest of Christ the King Parish, Wentworth in Durban.

The new council will continue to build on the initiatives developed as a result of the *Immense Hope* project and the vision and strategies of the last three years. It will deepen the strategies on a practical level and continue efforts to develop them. It will try to fulfil the six priorities of the mission vision of the Province. It will look to develop the initiatives building cultural and racial unity and solidarity in the Province.

Oblate Goes to Ganges

The headquarters of the Divine Life Society and the Sivanandashram in Durban invited him to participate at their expense. At the end of the pilgrimage they committed the ashes of their spiritual Master Sri Swami Sahajananda into the fast flowing waters of the Ganges.

The swami had been associated with Father Garth in interreligious encounter for more than twenty five years. During the height of South Africa's turbulent and violent resistance to the oppressive laws of segregation during 1970s and 1980s, Father Garth founded and animated the Community of Reconciliation in the premises of St Joan of Arc church in Pietermaritzburg.

The purpose of this community was to live in a multi cultural community of faith and prayer defying laws

of segregation and taking the consequences. The community comprised families, individuals, people from broken homes, the poor and the homeless.

One day Swami Sahajananda visited the community by surprise and put his head to the ground before the icon of JESUS in the sanctuary. Their long association began there.

Father Garth was at the bedside of Sri Swami Sahajananda, in long protracted silent prayer, a few hours before he died and he was then drawn intimately into the last rites and the cremation ceremony twenty eight hours after he died. This was attended by thousands of mourners mainly members of the Divine Life Society whose South African branch was founded by the Sri Swami Sahajananda.

In his many years of Interreligious collaboration Father Garth has remained inspired by the words of the Vatican II document *Nostrae Aetate* which states in paragraph 2:

The church therefore has this exhortation for her members: prudently and lovingly, through dialogue and collaboration with the followers of other religions and in witness of Christian life and faith acknowledge, preserve and promote the spiritual and moral goods (truths and values) found among these people, as well as the values in their society and culture.

Oblates are reminded that requests and permissions should be directed to the local superiors before coming to the Provincial.

The role of the local superior is indicated in Constitution 93. Oblates in these districts are to support the superior in his ministry.

93. The local Superior animates and directs the community in its religious life, furthers the apostolate, and upholds the best interests of the members. At the service of his brothers, the Superior brings the community together to evaluate its experience, to give itself objectives for its common life and apostolic projects, and to ensure their implementation. He invites their collaboration, and maintains close liaison with the Provincial as well as fraternal

contact with other communities of the Province.

Convocation of 2010 General Chapter

Father General recently convoked the General Chapter of 2010. It will begin on September 8, 2010 in Rome.

In his letter of convocation he notes that the purpose of the General Chapter is to "strengthen the bonds of unity and to express the members' participation in the life and mission of the Congregation. It therefore concerns all Oblates: old or young, in first formation, in full ministry or retired, Brothers and priests. All should have a chance to express their particular participation in our life and our mission. This means that the time of preparation should be one of prayer, of uniting ourselves more closely to Christ, of sharing in community and of reflection on our ministry".

"The Chapter Commissioner, to be appointed in May, and the Precapitular Commission, will provide the ways and means for us to move on together in our preparation. "

We are called to a "*Conversion to a better quality of our vowed life, and response to the poor whom we are sent to evangelize*".

In 2010, a new Superior General and his Council will be elected. As mandated by the last General Chapter, there will also be consideration of updated structures of government on all levels, in light of the needs of the Oblate mission.

He concludes in these words: I entrust the XXXV Chapter to your care and especially to your prayer. May Saint Eugene, Blessed Joseph Gerard, Blessed Joseph Cebula, and all the other Oblates who have left this world in God's friendship, intercede for us.

International Oblate Youth Encounter

This event will be held in July in Melbourne Australia from July 9-12. Each province may have one delegate: an Oblate involved in Youth ministry. For us this will be Fr Mxolisi Ngcobo. In addition the region will sponsor one delegate from Zimbabwe who is Fr Charles Nwabenje. The encounter will provide opportunities for prayer, reconciliation, shared culture, an experience of community and an exploration of the Oblate charism.

The International Oblate Youth Encounter has taken as its theme, "Witness to the World" which links to the official World Youth Day theme, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses".

Whilst every Oblate in KwaZulu Natal and Zimbabwe was visited at least once during the first term, a significant group was overlooked. These are the Natal Province Diaspora who are in mission or mission preparation elsewhere in the world. During May the Provincial will visit Natal Oblates in England, Ireland, Lourdes, Germany and Rome. He will also take the opportunity to visit the grave of his brother Geoffrey who passed away last year and to attend to some family matters.
